Fr. Elias Khouri is Assistant Priest at St. Elijah Antiochian Orthodox Church in Oklahoma City, OK. Fr. Elias was born and raised in Boston, Massachusetts. I was induced Saturday morning via prostaglandin and by the grace of God only needed 3 out if the 4 dosages and no further intervention. Janessa Craig (Amazing Doula), Seth, and I were able to watch all the Pascha Service which at the same time my contractions started. I went from 1.5 cm to 7.5 cm within a 3 hour check after the service! This miraculous progress allowed me to continue labor without the use of pitocine! Aidan was born within roughly 7-8 hours of when I started contracting. Thank you everyone for keeping us in your thoughts and for all the prayers! The prayers were definitely felt throughout this whole experience!
