COVID-19 Updates

As you all know, cases of COVID-19 have been on the rise in our area due to the different variants and strains that have arisen. As we prepare to re-open St. Nicholas Church for services and activities tomorrow, we would like to remind everyone of Quarantine and Isolation guidelines according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Per the CDC, please follow the below guidelines when deciding to attend any services or activities at St. Nicholas Church.


- Quarantine if you have been in close contact (within 6 feet of someone for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period) with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, unless you have been fully vaccinated.
- Please note that this may include people in your household, including children.
- People who are fully vaccinated do NOT need to quarantine after contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 unless they have symptoms.
- Fully vaccinated people should get tested 3-5 days after their exposure, even if they don't have symptoms and wear a mask indoors in public for 14 days following exposure or until their test result is negative

With the recent rise in cases across the US and particularly in Arkansas, we do recommend that masks be worn while indoors. This is our recommendation, not a requirement. As always, if anyone is experiencing symptoms, make sure you contact your physician.
