

We will be live streaming this service on the Antiochian Men YouTube Channel for everyone in our Diocese. St. Joseph the Betrothed is the patron saint of The Antiochian Men and having this Akathist live streamed has become an annual event in our Diocese. This year, the Akathist was originally planned to be live streamed from St. George Orthodox Cathedral in Coral Gables, FL, however, they have had to cancel all services this weekend due to a COVID-19 outbreak in their parish. 2022 DOMSE Winter Retreat Registration Is Open!


