# *Great Lent Schedule and Explanation of Services*

## *First Week of Great Lent:*

Sunday, February 26 — **Forgiveness Vespers** at 1:00p

Monday, February 27 — **Great Compline with Canon of Repentance** at 6:00p

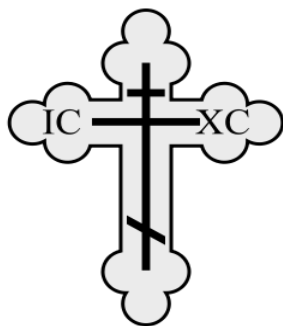
Tuesday, February 28 — **Great Compline with Canon of Repentance** at 6:00p

Wednesday, March 1 — **Presanctified Liturgy and Potluck Meal** at 6:00p

Thursday, March 2 — **Great Compline with Canon of Repentance** at 6:00p

Friday, March 3 — **Akathist (Madayeh) Service to the Theotokos** at 6:00p

Sunday, March 5 — **Triumph of Orthodoxy Vespers & Fellowship Meal** at 5:00p (Hosted at our Parish)



*In the afternoon we celebrate Vespers (taking down of Christ's body from the Cross). In the evening, the Lamentations Matins is sung. This service begins in a solemn manner as we lay to rest our Lord's body in the Tomb.*

*Holy Saturday is a day of hope and waiting. In the morning, as we celebrate Christ's victory over death, while singing: "Arise O God and Judge the earth, for to Thee belong all the nations." The Vespersal Divine Liturgy of Holy Saturday concludes the services of Holy Week, and brings us to the eve of Great and Holy Pascha.*

*Great and Holy Pascha is the celebration of the life-giving Resurrection of Jesus Christ. At this point the Resurrection is announced with the Gospel reading about the empty tomb (Mark 16: 1-8) which refers to the Angel's statement: "He is risen; He is not here."*

*On Sunday afternoon, the Agape Vespers is celebrated as the Gospel according to St. John, proclaiming the Good News of the Resurrection, is read in many different languages to demonstrate the universal character of our Lord's Resurrection.*

## Remaining Lenten Schedule:

*Raising of Lazarus and Palm Sunday* begin Holy Week. The Raising of Lazarus confirmed the universal resurrection from the dead that all of us will experience at our Lord's Second Coming. Our Lord enters Jerusalem and is proclaimed king; we use palms on this day to show that we too accept Jesus as the true King and Messiah.

*Bridegroom Orthros* and most of the other services of Holy Week are served "in anticipation." Each of these services has a particular theme: On Holy Monday, Blessed Joseph of Egypt, is commemorated. The Parable of the Ten Virgins is read on Holy Tuesday. The theme of Holy Wednesday is repentance and forgiveness as we remember the sinful woman who anointed our Lord before His death.

On *Holy Thursday* we turn to the events of our Lord's Passion. Thursday morning begins with commemorating the Mystical Supper. At this Liturgy a second Host is consecrated, which is distributed to the shut-ins and the sick throughout the year. In the evening, we celebrate Matins with Reading of the Twelve Passion Gospels.

*Holy Friday* is a day of strict fast. In the morning we celebrate the Royal Hours. These solemn hours are observed as we read the various accounts and hymns concerning the Crucifixion.

## *Holy Week Schedule and Explanation of Services*

*Great Compline* is a penitential evening prayer service that may include Canons, such as the *Canon of Repentance by St. Andrew of Crete*, which is sung during the first week of Great Lent. Most apparent feature is its penitential themes, demonstrating many examples of sin and repentance from the Old and New Testaments.

*Presanctified Liturgy* is an evening service of Lenten Vespers with the distribution of Holy Communion. Holy Communion is given from the Eucharistic gifts sanctified on the previous Sunday at the celebration of the Divine Liturgy, in the hopes of sustaining our Lenten ascetical efforts and discipline.

We will be rotating hosting of Presanctified Liturgy and Potluck Fellowship between our parish community and St. John of Chicago Orthodox Church in Rogers. Please bring food and drinks to share **ONLY** when we are hosting.

The *Akathist (Madayeh) Service* is a profound, devotional poem singing praises to the Holy Mother and Ever-Virgin, Mary. As the hymn is chanted all of the events related to our Lord's Incarnation are brought to attention for our contemplation.
