We are continuing our study on the Acts of the Apostles!


Journey to Fullness

With these factors in mind, we've decided to scale back efforts and have come up with the following simplified plan:

First Sunday of Month: Parish Potluck

Everyone planning to attend—family or individual—please bring one ready-to-serve dish (main, side, or dessert). Covered dishes should be dropped off on the serving tables at parish house prior to services. Please collect your dishes from table once serving time has ended.

Potlucks are typically the first Sunday of the month but may change according to festal calendar. Please check parish publications for any updates.

Remaining Sundays of Month: Donuts & Fruit

There may be an occasional switch to bagels or other items.

- Hospitality will continue to furnish coffee & lemonade, shelf-stable creamers, paper plates, napkins, tableware, plastic & styrofoam cups, but will be retiring the white coffee mugs.
- Monetary donations towards coffee and supplies are appreciated; please note on contribution envelopes (available in the Narthex) that your donation is specifically for Fellowship Hour. There will be a basket for cash donations at the parish house, as well.









Saint James - The Brother of the Lord

St. James is commemorated on October 23rd.




The Holy Apostle James, the Brother of God
(Adelphótheos) was the son of the Righteous
Joseph before he was betrothed to the Most
Holy Theotokos. Tradition says that Joseph had
other sons with his first wife.

Thus, James was called the Lord's brother. Saint James had been a Nazirite, a man or woman consecrated to God for a limited time. During the period of consecration the Nazirites vowed to to abstain from wine and other intoxicating beverages, they could not cut their hair, and all contact with a corpse was forbidden (Numbers 6:1-21).

When the Savior began to proclaim the Kingdom of God, Saint James believed in Christ and became His Apostle. Later, he was chosen as the first Bishop of Jerusalem.
